

Upon the foregoing Petition being read and considered, it is thereupon this 13th day of May, in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-two, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof, that the trustees herein named be authorized to proceed to place the proper acreage of the farm mentioned in these proceedings in corn, and to carry on the regular farming operations by hiring sufficient help to carry on the said work, provided, however, that they spend not more than 4.00 per day, and that they further secure the services of the said Howard W. Sevard to superintend and assist in the said work at the sum of 7.50 per week, and if it is impossible to get the proper assistance for the said trustees to carry on this work themselves, they are then authorized to ~~leave the said~~ ^{contact with} land unto a party willing to ~~take the same~~ ^{plant, cultivate and harvest the corn crop} for a one-half share ~~of the~~ ^{thereof} ~~products~~, provided, however, that all longfeed, including ~~hay~~ ^{feed}, be left on the premises. ~~And the said trustees are hereby further authorized to hire sufficient help to carry on all other necessary farm work on the said farm, provided, however, they do not pay out more than _____ per week for said work.~~
