(E.S.T.), all that farm located in Urbana District, Frederick County, Maryland, near Greenfield on Sears Road leaving from Park Mills Road toward the Sugarloaf Mountain and being the same real estate of which the said Edward Charles Sears died, seized and possessed, and more particularly described as follows:

FIRST PARCEL: All that farm consisting of 127 acres, 7 square perches, being part of "Resurvey on Chargeable" part of "Black Acre", part of "Foul Play", laying to the North and bordering on the County Road leading from Greenfield Mills to Barnesville and about one mile East of Greenfield, it being all and the same real estate as conveyed by Harry C. Hull, Trustee, to Edward C. Sears in a Deed dated September 29, 1922, and recorded in Liber 340, folio 311, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, EXCEPTING THEREFROM all that parcel of land and improvements containing one acre, fifteen square perches, as conveyed by Edward C. Sears to Evelyn A. Stone, et al., in a Deed dated July 29, 1955, and recorded in Liber 549, folio 523, one of said Land Records.

SECOND PARCEL: All that real estate described as all those three lots or parcels of land situate, lying and being in Urbana District, and being parts of a tract or parcel of land called, "Chargeable" and part of a tract called the "Resurvey of Chargeable" containing in the aggregate 26 acres, 3 rods and 18 square perches of land and being all and the same as conveyed by Harry M.
