Proctor the Testator therein named, sign and seal this Will; that they heard him publish, pronounce and declare the same to be his last Will and Testament; that at the time of his so doing he was, to the best of their apprehension, of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, and capable of executing a valid deed or contract, and that they respectively subscribed their names as Witnesses to said Will, in the presence of and at the request of the Testator and that they did also see each the other subscribing Witness sign his name as Witness to said Will, at the request of the Testator in his presence, and all in the presence of each other.
