

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. BENNETT:

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. EDWIN C. BROWN. SR.:

A No, I don't.

Q You paid the tax bills you said for a certain given length of time?

A Yes.

Q Do you have those tax bills?

A Yes.

MR. STEWART H. BROWN: Filed with this is an exhibit, Mr. Brown, one of the old tax bills. You notice it is the Proctor, William J. "Estate", ~~of~~ Mrs. Bernice Williams.

MR. EDWIN C. BROWN: I think that in order for Mrs. Williams to be reimbursed she should be able to produce some documents indicative of the taxes that she has paid on this particular piece of property - the property concerned.
