

Q (Mr. Stewart Brown) Do you have your other tax bills with you, Mrs. Williams? If you do, we will offer them as exhibits.

A Mr. Sheffield has one.

Q (Mr. E.C. Brown) Do you know what other years your attorney has, Mrs. Williams?

A No, not right offhand I don't.

MR. E.C. BROWN: I have no objection to these going into evidence, of taxes paid by Mrs. Williams for the years indicated thereon.

(Four tax bills were then offered in evidence as one exhibit, marked Complainants' Exhibit No. 1)

Q (Mr. Stewart Brown) I would like to ask one more question. Mrs. Williams, do you have any idea, for the record, of the value of this property? We are only concerned with these 50 acres of land that your grandfather specifically devised.

A Well, no.

Q Let me ask you this: prior to the institution of this suit were negotiations under way for the purpose of selling this property? Were you attempting to sell it and get the signatures of all the parties concerned?

A Yes.

Q Did you have an offer at that time to buy this property?

A You mean from one of the heirs?

Q No, I mean from anybody?

A Yes.

Q State what that offer was and how it was obtained.

A The offer was given to us by Mr. Wiles through a real estate agent, Mr. Horman.

Q What was the name of the prospective purchaser?

A Charles I. Wiles and his wife, Lela Wiles.

Q What was the amount offered at that time for this property?

A \$6,000.00.
