- A Well, that is a long story. I mean I can't remember him too well, but I did know him.
 - Q Now, Mr. Johnson, you say you know this property?
 - A Yes.
 - Q When were you there last?
 - A Last year.
 - Q Last year. What was its condition at that time?
 - A It had grown up quite a bit.
- Q Now you have testified that in your opinion this property can be divided amongst the heirs?
 - A Yes, sir.
 - Q In kind, that is? A. Yes.
