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ten acres was specified for different ones. So under this impression I thought it could be divided.

Q Was the ten acres that you speak of as being specified described to such an extent you could locate it?

A I wouldn't be able to locate it from the will, because I am not familiar with directions too well, but if someone told me where it was I think I could find it.

Q You think you could locate the each of the ten acres?

A Not each.

Q The one you would be involved in?

A If someone told me where it was I think I could find it just by visiting on the property.

Q You think you could give a description and locate it and mark it off?

A Well, according to the will I was told that it was joining another property, and the other property that I was told it was joining was property of Mrs. Williams. That is the only location I can give.

Q Do you have any idea of the value of this land?

A No, I don't really know the value of the land.

Q Do you know anything about the condition of the land as to whether or not it has improvements on it?

A I have only been to the property about a year ago, and at that time it had grown up.

Q Grown up with brush or timber?

A I noticed quite a lot of brush. I didn't pay too much attention to the timber, but there was some timber.

Q That's all.

CROSS EXAMINATION WAIVED BY MR. BENNETT.

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. STEWART BROWN:

Q Mrs. Summers, what relation are you to Jereline Johnson?

A Grandchild.

Q You are a granddaughter. You say you are 46?

A Yes.
