- A. The porch came right to the edge of the stones.
- Q. The outer edge or the inner edge?
- A. The inner edge.
- Q. That was how far from the north wall of the house?
- A. Six feet.
- Q. I would like to offer that as Exhibit #3. I show you another picture labeled Exhibit #4 and ask if you took this picture?
- A. This picture was taken exactly the same time.
- Q. These large stones that appear on the right side of this picture are they or are they not the same stones we referred to earlier.
- A. Yes, exactly the same stones.
- Q. And the porch came to the left hand side of the stones as you look at this picture?
- A. Right. Right to the edge. It bordered right along the edge of the stones.
- Q. That is all I have, Mr. Summers.

## CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. NEWMAN:

- Q. You say you lived in this house for 34 years. Can you tell us the years you lived there?
- A. I was born in 1916. I lived there until 1935. I attended
  Maryland Institute, but I never changed my address. I was back
  and forth on week-ends. I went into the service in '41, came back
  in '45 and stayed there until January '53.
- Q. Now, these pictures. Let's see Exhibit #1. This picture you say you took in 1945?
- A. Yes, I think that's the one I took in '45. It had a before and after.
- Q. Then Exhibit #3 is what you call the after picture.
- A. That's right.
- Q. This is that picture?
- A. That's the picture.
- Q. When was that taken?
- A. I came home in '45 and the spring of '46 was when I removed the porch and that was taken at the same time.
- Q. This picture was taken in '46 also?
- A. Right. After we removed the porch.
- Q. This picture was taken in '46. (Referring to Exhibit #4).
- A. Right,
- Q. The first one was taken in '44 and the other two taken in '46,
