- A. These are taken in '46 when I removed the porch. I had a picture exactly like that in '46 out of the same camera. I think that's the same picture. Maybe the date was put on there wrong. What is on the back of it.
- Q. '44.
- A. Well, that doesn't make any difference. Maybe that was taken prior to that. There's no change in it.
- Q. On the back of Exhibit #1 the porch was put on around 1890. How do you know the porch was put on about 1890?
- A. The only way I know that is what my mother has said in discussing the porch and all that.
- Q. You spoke about building a fence. How do you know when that fence was built?
- A. The only thing I can tell you is the porch was put on at the same time my grandfather redecorated the property - the porch went right along with the redecorating.
- Q. You have no definite knowledge of that?
- A. Only what my mother and parents have said.
- Q. These large flagstones that were there. You don't know whether they were put there by your grandfather or were there before?
- A. According to my mother, they were there when the property was purchased.
- Q. In 1890.
- A. Right.
- Q. And you cannot say you put them there or when they were put there?
- A. No. Although you look behind the fence and they are there in the older picture. If you look closely, you can see them.
- Q. This Exhibit just marked #2 - this was after your grandfather had completed his improvements?
- A. No, this is the first year he was there when he had restored the shutters and the picket fence is up, and according to the stories, I've forgotten how many hundreds of window panes had to be put into the house. That is the development at that time.
- Q. He put up the picket fence, however?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Of course you don't know who took this picture or anything about that?
- A. I know nothing about that.
