

A. That's right.

Q. Now, Mr. Summers, where did your mother get this property?

A. My father originally inherited it and eventually it was put in both names and when my father died, it became my mother's.

Q. When your father inherited the property, who did he inherit it from?

A. His mother.

Q. Where did she get the property?

A. She inherited it from her husband.

Q. Where did he get it?

A. He purchased it.

Q. Who did he purchase it from ?

A. I think Mr. Storm will have to answer that. I think a man by the name of Smith.

Q. Do you know whether there is in the deed that your father got from Smith any description of the North line of this property?

A. The north line - the property was on both sides of the road. At the time it was twenty point some acres. There were ten acres of it on one side of the road and ten on the other.

Q. When your mother died, did she own ten acres on one side of the road and ten on the other?

A. No, over a period of years it was sold off other than the remaining portion which they claim now is three acres and house and barn.

Q. Did your mother sell the portion north of the road.

A. Yes, she sold that to Mr. Grove who has a driving range and a drive in theatre.

Q. Can you tell me what his name is?

A. William Grove.

Q. When did she sell it to him?

A. She sold that in - roughly I would say 1947, but I don't know exactly.

Q. Now, when your grandfather purchased this property from Smith, can you tell us when that was?

A. 1890 to the best of my knowledge.

Q. Does that deed contain any description of this property with reference to the road.

A. To my knowledge, it does not.

Q. You say, or your claim that your family has always claimed six feet in front of the dwelling. Can you give me any written - or anything in writing to support that claim?
