

Q. The plat on record of the State Roads Commission marked Exhibit #8937 with the Defendant's Answer shows certain land proposed to be taken by the State Roads Commission, does it not?

A. It does.

Q. Not all that land which the State Roads Commission proposed to take relates to this house or the land about this house, does it?

A. It does, I think, show as easement areas some of the land which is covered in this contract.

Q. It shows none of the land in the house or which the house covers as being sought by the state, does it?

A. No.

Q. The dwelling near the walk in front of the dwelling, it does not show that any of that is sought by the state, does it?

A. From the plat it would indicate that they already claimed the right of way line ran through the dwelling and they sought nothing at that point.

Q. The release only relates to those lands which they sought through this plat.

A. That's correct.

Q. I think that is all I am going to ask you.
