

A. Yes, that's right.

Q. All of the land on the south side has either been transferred to you or is being offered to Dr. White.

A. That's right.

CROSS EXAMINATION BY MR. NEWMAN:

Q. Mr. Summers, when did you purchase your portion of the land south of the road?

A. '47 or 48. No, 1952.

Q. You bought it from your mother?

A. Yes.

Q. Do you have a copy of your deed here?

A. Not here, but I have it.

Q. Mr. Storm in his examination referred to a certain deed dated November 26, 1952 and recorded in Liber 510, Folio 8, is that your property?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. And you do not have that deed here?

A. No, I didn't know you needed it.

Q. Were you born in 1913?

A. That's right.

Q. Were you born in this house?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Do you know - where do you claim is the north line of the property which you have sold to Dr. White?

A. It was always my opinion that the fence lines was the line between the State Roads Commission and our property.

Q. How far was the fence line in front of the dwelling house?

A. It goes out to the stones and you can see by Exhibit #6 - it shows you where the fence lines come down there and it starts/east ^{again} of the house.

Q. Can you tell me in feet how many feet that fence is in front of the house?

A. No, I can't tell you that.

Q. Can you tell me or refer me to any writing of any sort that places the north line of the property where you say it ought to be?

A. No, I cannot. I do remember reading sometime back up at the court house where in transferring land to the State Roads Commission - 1911 or somewhere in there - with turnpikes they gave you two years to remove all toll gates and buildings off the
