TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Supplemental Bill of Complaint of Dorsey L. Rice, Clarence C. Rice, Walter M. Rice, Beryl E. Gordon, Raymond C. Rice, Howard K. King, Eleanor Mae Easterday, and Charles F. King respectfully shows unto your Honors:

1. That on the 25th day of September, 1963, your Petitioners filed in your Honorable Court a Bill of Complaint alleging, among other things, the death of Clyde E. Rice, intestate, on or about the 9th day of April, 1963, at which date he was seized and possessed of an undivided one-third interest in a valuable farm located in Jefferson Election District of Frederick County, Maryland.

2. That one of the heirs-at-law of the said decedent was a niece, Anna Grace King, whose last known address was Baltimore, Maryland.

3. That subpoenas were duly issued by the Clerk of your Honorable Court on the 25th day of September, 1963, and the 9th day of October, 1963, respectively, and forwarded to the Sheriff of Baltimore City for service upon the said Anna Grace King, both of which said subpoenas have been returned "non est".

4. That the immediate family of the said Anna Grace King have had no contact with her since about the year 1942; that, notwithstanding, every possible lead was investigated and exhausted in an effort to effect personal service upon the said Defendant, namely: (a) the Baltimore City Directory, (b) the Baltimore and Suburban Telephone Directories, (c) the Employee Directory of The Martin Company, where it was reported that the said Defendant was formerly employed, and (d) the Social Security Administration, all of which proved unavailing.
