5. That, to date, none of the aforesaid Defendants have appeared, answered or shown any cause why a Decree should not be passed as prayed by the original Bill of Complaint, as commanded by said Order of Publication.

6. That by a Supplemental Bill of Complaint filed herein on the 15th day of January, 1964, your Petitioner suggested the death of Clarence C. Rice, one of the original Plaintiffs to these proceedings, on or about the 30th day of December, 1963, intestate, and respectfully suggested that the heirs-at-law of said Defendant named in said Supplemental Bill of Complaint be made parties defendant, which was accordingly done by an Order of your Honorable Court passed herein on the 15th day of January, 1964.


7. That subpoenas have been issued, and duly served upon the several heirs-at-law of the said Clarence C. Rice, deceased, as will more fully appear by reference to the proceedings herein, and all of said heirs-at-law have appeared and answered the proceedings herein except Patricia Lou Lewis, Connie L. Kinna and Hilda May Rice, who are infants under the age of twenty-one years, and thus cannot answer and defend the aforesaid suit for themselves.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioners pray that your Honorable Court will pass the following Orders, to-wit:

(1) An Order that the Bill of Complaint herein be taken pro confesso against the said Anna Grace King, Defendant, if living, and against the unknown heirs, devisees or personal representatives, resident or non-resident, of the said Anna Grace King, if not living, and

(2) An Order appointing a guardian ad litem to appear and answer for the aforesaid infant Defendants.
