

- A. She died in 1942.
- Q. Did she leave any children surviving?
- A. Four children.
- Q. What are their names?
- A. Howard K. King, Anna Grace King, Eleanor Mae Easterday and Charles F. King.
- Q. When did your brother, Clarence, die?
- A. December 30, 1963.
- Q. Was he married at the time of his death?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Did he leave any children surviving?
- A. Yes, five children.
- Q. Mrs. Gordon, the Bill of Complaint in this case states that the last known address of your niece, Anna Grace King, was Baltimore, Maryland, and the Supplemental Bill of Complaint filed in this cause on November 13, 1963, states that the Sheriff of Baltimore City has been unable to locate Miss King for the purpose of serving process on her in this case. Will you explain the circumstances relating to the disappearance of Miss King?
- A. The last time I talked to her was at her mother's funeral in 1942, and I haven't seen or heard from her since.
- Q. Do you know if any of her family have had further contact with her since that date?
- A. No, I do not believe so.
- Q. At this time you would not know whether Miss King is living or dead?
- A. No, I wouldn't know.
- Q. Or whether she is a resident of the State of Maryland, or a non-resident?
- A. No, I wouldn't know that.
- Q. And if she is dead, whether a personal representative has been appointed for her estate?
- A. No, I don't know.
