

Washington County, Maryland; a niece, Annie M. Leferre, widow, residing at 410 West Wilson Boulevard, Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland; a niece, Emma Stottlemyer, widow, residing at 518 East Franklin Street, Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland; and the following children of a deceased sister, Susie Summers, to-wit: a nephew, Luther C. Remsberg, whose wife's name is Bessie Remsberg, residing at Route 2, Middletown, Maryland; and a niece, Alma F. Ramsburg, whose husband's name is Harry Ramsburg, residing at Route 5, Frederick, Maryland, to which aforesaid heirs-at-law title to the real estate described in the preceding paragraph hereof descended to and vested in by virtue of operation of law.

(3) That on the 30th day of April, 1962, Ray C. Gladhill was appointed and qualified as Administrator of the personal estate of the said decedent, as will more fully appear by reference to a certified copy of letters of administration filed herewith as "Exhibit No. 3", and prayed may be considered a part hereof.

(4) That your Complainants, trading as the Gladhill Company, were engaged to prepare the body of the decedent for burial, and to conduct the funeral therefor, and in that connection incurred funeral expenses in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), a copy of the account thereof being filed herewith as "Exhibit No. 4", and prayed may be considered a part hereof, which said account, as well as obligations owing unto various other persons incurred in the lifetime of the said decedent, remain currently unpaid.

(5) That your Complainants are informed, verily believe, and so aver, that the said Philip I. Fisher did not leave personal estate sufficient to pay his just debts and the costs of administration, and they are advised that the same now in the hands of the Administrator, if any, ought to be applied to the payment of the claim of your Orators and other creditors of the said Philip I. Fisher so far as the same will extend, and that any deficiency in the said personal estate ought to be supplied by a sale of all, or such part as may be necessary, of the real estate of the aforesaid debtor.
