Q. Has your account been paid?

A. No, no part.

Q. Where did Mr. Fisher live at the time of his death?

A. He lived in what we term as Fisher's Hollow, which is Route 1,
Myersville Post Office.

Q. Fisher's Hollow is approximately how far from the Village of Harmony?

A. It is approximately a mile northeast of this village.

Q. At the time of Mr. Fisher's death, did he own any real estate?

A. Yes.

Q. Will you describe generally the type of real estate which the
decedent owned?

A. Well, the real estate consisted of approximately four acres, im-
proved with a log and frame shack in very poor condition.
There is also a small stable.

Q. Are the buildings beyond repair?

A. The house is beyond repair; the stable can be repaired.

Q. Mr. Gladhill, I show you a certified copy of a deed from
Elmira Fisher to Philip I. Fisher, dated August 28, 1920,
recorded in Liber No. 342, folio 544, one of the Land
Records of Frederick County, Maryland, and filed in these
proceedings as Exhibit "No. 2". Will you examine the
deed, and state whether or not it correctly describes the
property which Mr. Fisher owned at the time of his death?

A. This appears to be the property.

Exhibit "No. 2" filed with the examiner as evidence, and
so marked.

Q. You will note from the deed, Mr. Gladhill, that the Grantor,
Mrs. Elmira Fisher, reserved a life estate in the property
described therein. Is Mrs. Fisher still living?

A. No, she is dead.

Q. When did she die?

A. According to my records, on November 5, 1937.
