

wall southwardly to the margin of said turnpike, thence by and with said margin of said turnpike 13 feet, more or less, to the beginning. LESS the portion thereof containing 1190 square feet conveyed by Edna Grey unto Price Electric Corp., by deed dated June 18, 1952, and recorded in Liber No. 503, Folio 483, one of the Land Records of Frederick County. BEING the same real estate which was devised by the Last Will and Testament of Jennie Temple unto Edna Grey, said will being recorded in Wills Book H.D.R. No. 1, Folio 586, one of the records in the Office of the Register of Wills for Frederick County, the said Jennie Temple having been predeceased by her husband, William H. Temple. That the said Edna Grey, also known as Eleanor Grey, is believed to have subsequently married one Bowens, whose full name is unknown, and it is believed that they both have departed this life, and if either or both are living, their addresses are unknown.

THIRD: That the Plaintiff has paid the sum of Fifty-three Dollars and Forty-six Cents (\$53.46) toward the purchase of the real estate hereinabove described and sold by the County Treasurer as aforesaid. That the sum of One Hundred Eighty-nine Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$189.50) including taxes, interest and costs, necessary to redeem the property as aforesaid has not been paid, and the property, therefore, has not been redeemed, and that more than one year from the date of sale has passed; all of which is more particularly shown on the Certificate of Redemption issued by the Treasurer of Frederick County and filed herewith and marked "Exhibit B" and prayed to be taken as a part of this Petition.

TO THE END, THEREFORE:

1. That a final decree shall be passed foreclosing all rights of redemption of the Defendants in and to the property assessed to Eleanor Gray Bowens in Frederick City, Frederick County, Maryland.

2. And for such other and further relief as the nature of their case may require.

Your Petitioner further prays that an Order of Publication may be passed by your Honorable Court to be published in some newspaper in Frederick County, giving notice to Eleanor Gray Bowens, also known as Edna Gray or Grey, her unknown spouse, her unknown heirs, personal representatives or assigns, and all persons having or claiming to have any interest in the property, commanding them to be and appear in your Honorable Court in person or by solicitor on some certain date to be named therein, and show cause, if any they have, why the relief prayed for should not be granted.
