He filled out the papers that I had gotten at the Court House, and I got Dr. Thomas Love from Thurmont also. He came down about 5 o'clock, I believe, after his office hours, and he examined him and he filled out another one of them. We called Barton's ambulance and they came I think it was about six o'clock or somewhere in about, and they took him down to Springfield.

Q Had there been any signs of mental disability evidenced prior to this incident you have just related?

A Yes.

THE COURT: I don't think we have to go into that, Mr. Holter. I mean the doctors' certificates are sufficient.

MR. HOLTER: All right, we will withdraw the question.

Q As a result of the examination made by Dr. Gray is this the certificate that he issued?

A Yes, sir.

Q We would like to offer that in evidence.

Q Will you relate to the Court the names of your father's nearest relatives?

A The only relatives are his four children.
