Q What property does your mother have?

Q And what is the approximate value of that?

A I was trying to get her to put in an application for the Keedy Home. In case she wanted to go over I actually mailed it for her, as to the value of the home. I said around \$12,000; but I talked to a real estate man, Leonard Sherman, in Mt. Airy, over the week-end, about the approximate value, and Leonard told me he thought around \$11,000.

Q Is it your opinion your mother is unable to care for her property because of her disability?

A That is the way I feel. I feel someone might take advantage of her - my brothers and I talked it over, and if we sell the property, which it looks like we will do, it would be put in a trust fund to be used to take care of her.

Q It is your desire that the Court appoint you as Trustee of your mother's property?

A Yes.
