Q Would you give a brief description of the property.

Q How is the house constructed?

A It is weatherboard with a metal roof.

Q The other outbuildings, how are they constructed?

A The garage is cement block, and the other buildings are weatherboard, the meat house is cement block too.

MR. GASTLEY: Now we want to offer the original deeds to the property, designated as "Exhibit 1" and "Exhibit 2" and filed with the Bill of Complaint.

Q In this bill of complaint you have asked the Court to appoint a Trustee to sell the real estate, is this correct?

A Yes.

Q Is this real estate susceptible of partition without material loss and injury to the parties entitled therein?

A No.

Q It is your opinion then, in order to make a division of the interests in this property that the real estate be sold and the proceeds thereof divided among the parties according to their several interests?

A Yes.

Q The original deeds that I have offered in evidence, being Exhibit 1 and Exhibit 2, are they the original deeds of this property to you and the defendant?

A Yes.
