- Q. Will you state their names and addresses, please?
- A. His oldest child was George I. Brandenburg, who presently resides at 4633 Plato Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee. His next child was a daughter, Mrs. Betty Poole, who lives at Route 2, Boonsboro, Maryland. The next child was Glendora R. Ballam, who lives at Route 2, Boonsboro, Maryland. - A. What they told me was that she had no control over her bowels or over her water. I had been taking her to the University Hospital for a long time, and the whole one side was like it was paralyzed. She got so she couldn't walk, and she went to the nursing home, and they said they couldn't handle her out there.
