About 8 o'clock last night the 20th inst. after the 6th Regiment had assembled at their Armory Cor. Front and Fayette St the mob broke into the building when a volley was fired from the windows of the Armory. Some of the shots it is supposed were fired in the air and others into the mob, and Thos. V. Payne no. 274 N. Gay St was shot through the head and instantly killed. Two companies passed out and started down Front St. when they were assailed with bricks and stones, the soldiers then commenced an indiscriminate fire on the mob, Patrick Hill Cor. Front & Plowman St was shot through the hips at the corner of Batts St & Front St and died in a few minutes Louis Sinevitch, Cornelius Murphy, Wm. Kearsand, John H. Francis, the Menaca, Geo. M. McDonald and John Reinhardt were all shot and killed along the line of Batts St between Front & St Paul St. The bodies were all brought to the Station House and claimed by their friends, and removed with the exception of one of Hill who has no relatives in this County. Mark J. Dond, Wm. S. Young, Jacob Wagner, W. E. Callender and John Neville were all wounded and removed to the Washington University, a boy named John North was also wounded and removed to his home no. 18 E. Front St. Gary William was also wounded and removed to his home no. 175 E. Pratt St and his physician pronounced him to be fatally injured. James O'Rourke no. 19 Altemark St and George Stump no. 31 Forest St were both badly wounded and are now lying in the Station House. O'Rourke it is thought fatally. Wm. Brighton residing no. 38 1/2 N. Batts St was slightly wounded on the left chest by a musket ball and much alarmed. Sherman residing no. 224 N. Bond St was shot in the left side and badly wounded.
