Catholics to sell inner city graveyards

What is going to happen when cemeteries in the inner-city start to move corpses up to 150 years old into the suburbs? The city of Baltimore may find out soon enough.

The Maryland State Legislature, in its last session, passed a bill to permit the Catholic St. Vincent's and St. Peter's cemeteries to move the dead to Woodlawn Cemetery in Baltimore County.

St. Peter's graveyard, off the 1400 block of Bentalou St. in West Baltimore, is over 150 years old and has some 20,000 bodies, according to Percy Gillard, caretaker.

St. Vincent's cemetery in Clifton Park in East Baltimore dates back to the pre-Civil War period and has over 2,000 recorded graves.

Both graveyards are inactive. No burials have taken place at St. Peter's since 1972 and none at St. Vincent's since 1955.

Mr. Gillard has been caretaker over 65 years and is very much aware of the faults at St. Peter's.

He told the AFRO. "It

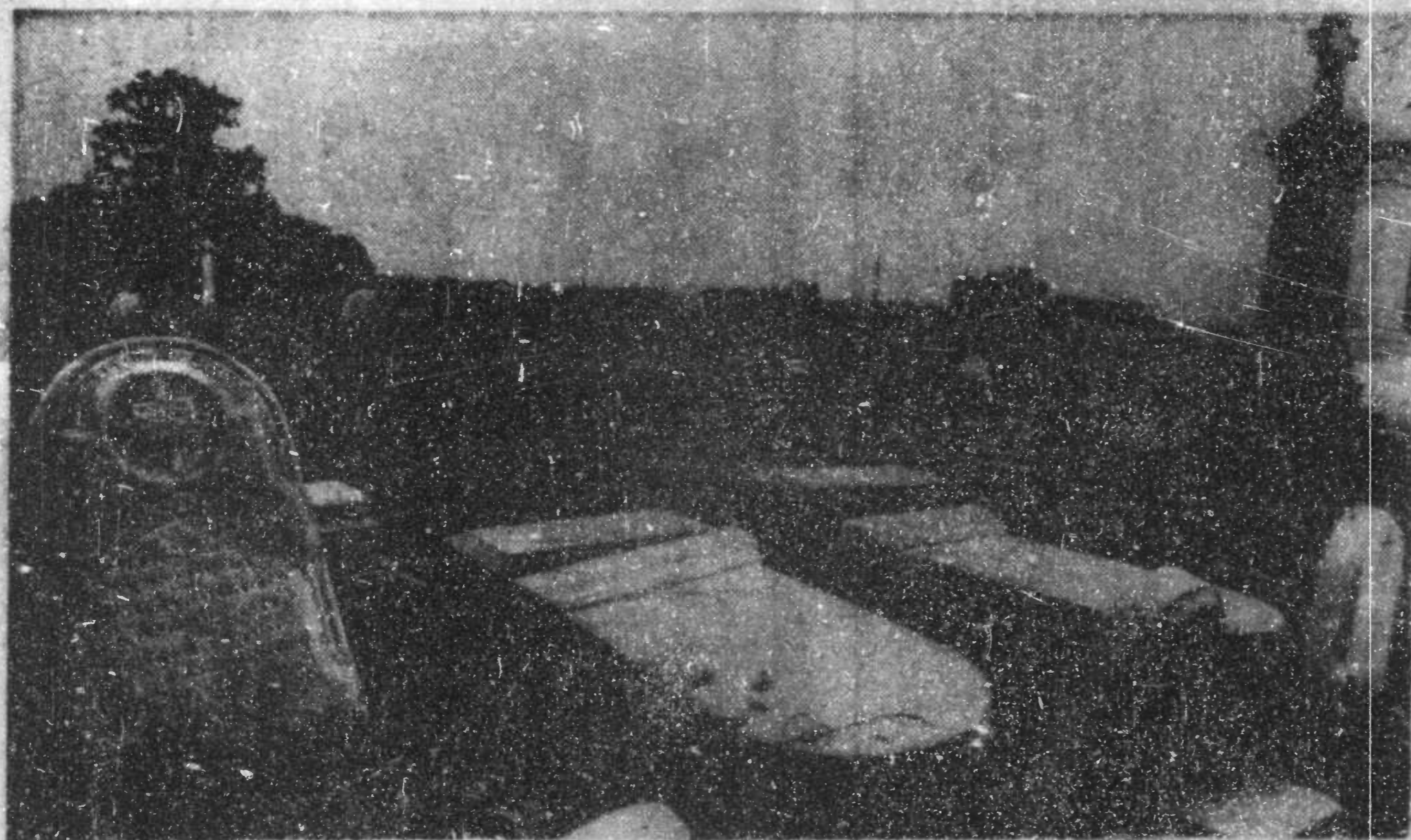

What is going to happen when cemeteries in the inner-city start to move corpses up to 150 years old into the suburbs? The city of Baltimore may find out soon enough.

The Maryland State Legislature, in its last session, passed a bill to permit the Catholic St. Vincent's and St. Peter's cemeteries to move the dead to Woodlawn Cemetery in Baltimore County.

St. Peter's graveyard, off the 1400 block of Bentall St. in West Baltimore, is over 150 years old and has some 20,000 bodies, according to Percy Gillard, caretaker.

St. Vincent's cemetery in Clifton Park in East Baltimore dates back to the pre-Civil War period and has over 2,000 recorded graves.

Both graveyards are inactive. No burials have taken place at St. Peter's since 1972 and none at St. Vincent's since 1955.

Mr. Gillard has been caretaker over 65 years and is very much aware of the faults at St. Peter's.

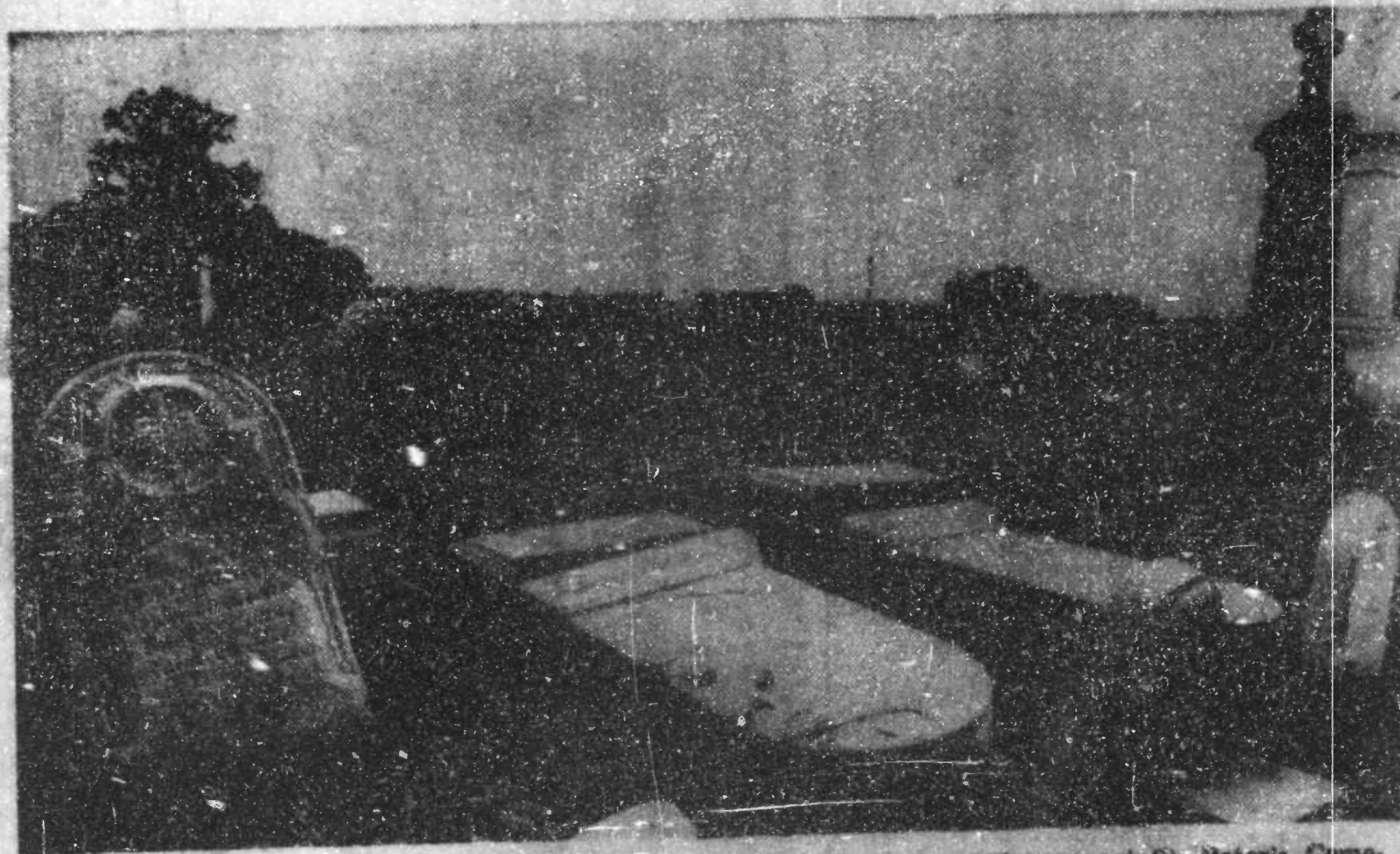
