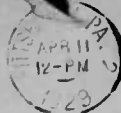

My dear Mr. Galerneau,-

I am enclosing check of \$300. which I have made payable to the Treasurer of Wye parish.

I am also sending you a statement of the William's fund, which amounts to \$11,722.89. This is invested as follows:

- \$1000. bond, Chicago, Indianapolis and Louisville R. R., 1015. (6%)
- 1000. Penn. Public Corporation (5%)
- 1500. Columbia railway Power and Light Co. \$1522.50 (6%)
- 100. Tri State Tel. and Tel. Co. \$101.50 (5 1/2%)
- 100. Humble Oil and Refining Co. \$150. (5 1/2%)
- 7500. Mortgage Robt T. Simpson (5%)
- 438.39 Savings Dept. Easton Nat. Bank (4%)
- Total ----- \$11,722.89

Of course you will expect that the capital fund will vary a little as the value of the bonds becomes higher or lower. As soon as the fund was turned over to Judge Watkins, he has received in interest \$973.72 and has paid out as follows:

- June 9 - 1922 Acknowledgments \$11.50
- July 15 - " W. J. Tuttle, treas. Wye parish \$200.
- Dec. 22, 1922 Check to Bishop Davenport \$200.
- February 27, 1922 check to Bishop Davenport, \$300.
- Balance in hand is \$272.22

You will notice that the last two checks have been made out to me and that I have endorsed them over to the Treasurer of Wye Parish. The Judge seems to think that as the money was left to the Convention that this is the right procedure.

The fund is so invested that the income will be, according to my figuring, in the neighborhood of \$780 or \$790. a year. I should very much deprecate using all of this for parish expenses for I am fearful that if this is done it would have the influence of endowments in other parishes where the people are doing very little and relying almost entirely upon the income of their endowments. Your parish has done so well in the past that we don't want to run this risk. I am therefore suggesting that at the next meeting of your vestry you appoint a committee which with yourself, shall have authority to meet with me and determine just how the fund can best be used to meet the needs and yet be in harmony with the terms of the bequest. When this committee has been appointed kindly let me know and I will arrange a time for your coming to Easton.


