At w<sup>ch</sup> s<sup>d</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> day of May the same Sherrife Retornes the writ afores<sup>d</sup> & Saith th<sup>t</sup> he hath taken the s<sup>d</sup> Jo. Balley whose p. 20 Bodie he hath at the day and place as the writ Requires

Uppon the Peticon of Jo. Balley tht in ffebruary Ct 1668 he had Judgment agt him at the suite of Reymond Stapleford for 100. Sterling & through the mistake of the then Clerke the Judgmt was Entered for noe Certaine summe to be Received agt wth Judgmt the Peticon preferred his bill in Chancery to wth the st Stapleford Answt upon Oath & therein ownes the st Judgmt to be but for One hundred Pounds Sterling & in December Ct 1670 the Peticon then Complt & the defend being upon Arbitracon their Attorneys let the st Cause in Chancery be discontinued since wth the st Stapleford falsely informing his Excelency th the st Judgmt was for Two Thousand Pounds Sterling Procured ord for a Scire facias agt the Peticon to shew Cause why Execucon should not issue for 2000.
