B. to be one) doe send vnto me a iust and true accompt yearly of all such things above mentioned as are or shall from time to time become due vnto me within the said Prov: & of their proceedings in the same signed w<sup>th</sup> their hands. And I doe hereby revoke all former authorities or Commissions w<sup>ch</sup> I have heretofore made or sent thether concerning the premises or any part therof so far forth as they or any of them doe concerne the premises only or any part therof & no further: declaring hereby that I shall not make good any contract or bargaine for the future concerning any of the premises there, but what shalbe agreed vnto by my said Commiss<sup>rs</sup> or two of them at least (wherof the said G. B. to be alwaies one) which Revocation I doe require the said Commiss<sup>rs</sup> to notifie vnto the English inhabitants of the said Province by causing this p<sup>nt</sup> writing to be published in the most vsuall places of publishing things of the like nature within the said Province, In witnes wherof I have herevnto sett my hand & seale at armes. At Bristoll in the Realme of England the 18<sup>th</sup> day of novemb anno d<sup>ni</sup> 1643.

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Instruccōns given by me Cecilius Lord Baltemore to my Commiss<sup>rs</sup> for my Treāry in maryland, dated the 18<sup>th</sup> day of novemb 1643.

1. vpon the receipt of these Instruccōns I would have them cause a true Inventory to be made as soone as conveniently may be of all my cattell, w<sup>ch</sup> I would have from time to time marked duely w<sup>th</sup> my marke, and of all other goods & chattells whatsoever belonging to me within the said Prov. of maryland, specifying therein in whose hands & in what places they are: And likewise a true Rentall of all such rents as are payable vnto me there. In both w<sup>ch</sup> I require my Secretary there to direct them. And that the Comm<sup>rs</sup> cause true copies of the said Inventory and Rentall to be sent (by the first opportunity) to me signed with two of their hands at least (wherof the said G. B. to be one.

2. That they continue those goods of mine w<sup>ch</sup> were (by my directions) formerly putt into m<sup>r</sup> Gilmetts custody, still in his hands as long as he staires in Maryland, or I give other directions concerning them. But I would have the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> to demand & keepe a note vnder m<sup>r</sup> Gilmetts hand of the p<sup>ticulars</sup> therof, acknowledging them to be in his custody

3. That all my carpenters & other apprentice servants there be sold forthwith for my best advantage, w<sup>ch</sup> I vnderstand will yeild at least 2000<sup>w<sup>t</sup></sup> tob apiece althoughe they have but one yeare to serve, especially if they be carpenters. for I vnder-
