Giuen to his Lordships Lieutenant heere & to require him to
depart the Province.

That in case he find opportunity he insinuate vnto the People
there seated that in case they make theyr application to his
Lordships Govern^t heere they shall find good Condicōns, Ac-
cording to the Condicōns of Plantacōn granted to all Commers
into this Province w^{ch} shall be made good to them: & that they
shall haue protection in theyr liues, libertys, & estates w^{ch} they
shall bring with them.

Letter sent by Coll Vtie to Delaware I receaued a letter from you directed to me
as the lord Baltmores Governor & lieutenant
of the Province of Maryland wherein you suppose your selfe to
be Governor of a people seated in a part of Delaware Bay w^{ch}
I am very well informed lyeth to the southward of the degree
forty & therefore can by no meanes owne or acknowledge any
for Governor there but my selfe who am by his lo^p appointed
lieutenant of his whole Province lyeing betweene the degrees
38 & 40: but do by these require & command you presently
to depart forth of this his lōps Province or otherwise desire you
to hould me excused if I vse my Vtmost endeavour to reduce
that part of his Lōps Province vnto its due obedience vnder
him.

Tuesday 4th October 1659.

Upon Information given by Richard Pight Clerke of the
Irons in the Mint, that Cicill Lord Baltimore and diverse others
with him, and for him, have made and transported great sums
of money, and doe still goe on to make more.
Lord Baltimore to be appreh^d Ordered, That a Warrant be issued forth to the
said Richard Pight for the apprehending of the Lord Baltimore
and such others as are suspected to be ingaged with him, in
the said offence, and for the seizing of all such monys stamps,
toolles and Instruments for coyning the same, as can be met
with, and to bring them in safe Custody to the Councill.
