

Liber H. H. line drawn east into the maine Ocean from Watkins point being the north point of th<sup>t</sup> Bay into w<sup>ch</sup> the River Wighco (form<sup>ly</sup> called Wighcocomoco, afterwards Pocomoke & now Wighcocomoco againe) doth fall exclusiuey That is to say fifty acres for eu<sup>y</sup> p<sup>son</sup> transp<sup>it</sup>d upon such Condi<sup>c</sup>ōns & terms as are expressed in his lo<sup>ps</sup> Condi<sup>c</sup>ōns of plantacōn now remaining vpon Record regulated according to his lo<sup>ps</sup> Declara<sup>c</sup>ōn of the 22<sup>th</sup> 7br 1658 now vpon record, alsoe p<sup>ro</sup>vid<sup>e</sup>d th<sup>t</sup> eu<sup>y</sup> p<sup>son</sup> claiming any land by Vertue of the condi<sup>c</sup>ōns afores<sup>d</sup> for & in respect of the Transportacō of any p<sup>son</sup> or p<sup>sons</sup> into this p<sup>ro</sup>vince doe before the s<sup>d</sup> Step. Horsey Cap<sup>t</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Thorne & W<sup>m</sup> Bosman or any two of th<sup>m</sup> & being within this p<sup>ro</sup>vince take the Oath of Fidelity by the s<sup>d</sup> Condi<sup>c</sup>ōns of plantacōn required w<sup>ch</sup> s<sup>d</sup> oath the s<sup>d</sup> Step. Horsey Cap<sup>t</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Thorn & W<sup>m</sup> Bosman or any two of th<sup>m</sup> are hereby impow<sup>r</sup>d to admitt<sup>r</sup> to all or any the p<sup>sons</sup> desireous to transp<sup>it</sup> th<sup>m</sup>selves as afores<sup>d</sup> before they shall have any Warr<sup>ts</sup> gr<sup>d</sup> vnto th<sup>m</sup> respectively & alsoe p<sup>ro</sup>vid<sup>e</sup>d th<sup>t</sup> all such p<sup>sons</sup> as shall haue any Warr<sup>ts</sup> gr<sup>d</sup> be acco<sup>u</sup>table to the Secr<sup>e</sup>tary for the time being for all such ffes as for the s<sup>d</sup> Warr<sup>s</sup> & entries shall becom due & the s<sup>d</sup> Step. Horsey Cap<sup>t</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Thorne & W<sup>m</sup> Bosman are hereby impow<sup>r</sup>d to keep a book of all such R<sup>ts</sup> and Warr<sup>ts</sup> as shalbe by th<sup>m</sup> or any of th<sup>m</sup> grant<sup>d</sup> distinctly reciting the name & Surname of eu<sup>y</sup> p<sup>son</sup> for & in respect of whos transportacōn they have allowed any land & the same at the end of the 6 months afores<sup>d</sup> to return into the Sec<sup>r</sup>tar<sup>ys</sup> office signed with their hands & forasmuch in a place now peopl<sup>d</sup> some differences may betweene p<sup>ty</sup> & p<sup>ty</sup> arise or Crimes be perpetrated & Comitted for the p<sup>r</sup>seruacon of the peace & better govern<sup>t</sup> of the people there resideing Wee doe hereby impow<sup>r</sup> the s<sup>d</sup> Step. Horsey Cap<sup>t</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Thorne & W<sup>m</sup> Bosman or any too of th<sup>m</sup> to heare & determine all causes not exceeding 2000<sup>l</sup> of Tob. as alsoe to cause to be app<sup>r</sup>hend<sup>d</sup> & punished any Criminall offending ag<sup>t</sup> any the laws of this p<sup>ro</sup>vince provided they proceed not to take life or memb<sup>r</sup> Given att S<sup>t</sup> Mary's vnder the lesser Seale of this province this 26<sup>th</sup> Day of May in the Two & thirtieth yeare of his lo<sup>ps</sup> Dominion ouer the said Province Annoq Domini one thousand six hundred sixty ffowre.
