

ences betweene the said Governm<sup>ts</sup> touching the Antient & knowne bound betweene them on the Easterne Shore & whereas the honorable S<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Berkeley Governo<sup>r</sup> of Virg<sup>a</sup> did appoint Coll Edmund Scarburgh, M<sup>r</sup> John Cattlett, and M<sup>r</sup> Richard Lawrence or any two of them whereof the said Scarburgh, to be one to give a meeting to the deputyes or Substitutes of this governm<sup>t</sup> by the Governo<sup>r</sup> thereof to be appointed (in case any dispute should arise where Watkins point was, th<sup>t</sup> being the bound of this province,) to determine what should be reasonably proposed by the s<sup>d</sup> Deputyes, In pursuance whereof the said Coll Scarburgh without the said Cattlett or Lawrence or Conuenient Notice Giuen to mee did about the tenth of Octob<sup>r</sup> last in an hostile maner enter many miles into this province to the Terror of the people at Monoakin & Anamessecks, beating, abusing & imprisoning the people there by him long before seated by vertue of a Comission from this governm<sup>t</sup> directed and Contrary to his Certaine knowledge of the bounds of the said province. And whereupon Remonstrance of this vndue proceeding to the hono<sup>r</sup><sup>ble</sup> S<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Berkeley by myselve in p<sup>son</sup> he did not only disclaime any Ord<sup>r</sup> from him to the said Scarburgh alone or before Notice given & debate had touching the point in difference to proceed by force as he did but was pleased further by his Ord<sup>r</sup> of 28<sup>th</sup> of March last to ord<sup>r</sup> the s<sup>d</sup> Scarburgh with one or both the Surveyors Cattlett or Lawrence afores<sup>d</sup> Cap<sup>t</sup> Josheph Bridger Cap<sup>t</sup> Robert Elkison, & M<sup>r</sup> Bulmer Mitford to give a meeting to such Com<sup>rs</sup> as should by mee be appointed at Monoakin 10<sup>th</sup> of May last & in case of my refusall of th<sup>t</sup> soe Just a proposall to proceed According as in th<sup>t</sup> Comission they were Ordred Now know yee th<sup>t</sup> forasmuch as neither the s<sup>d</sup> John Cattlett nor Richard Lawrence appeared att Monoakin at the time appointed without one of which nothing could be legally by the rest done th<sup>t</sup> did appeare & to shew how wee are not to be Ticed out of our desires of faire Correspondence with the hono<sup>r</sup><sup>ble</sup> Governo<sup>r</sup> & Councill of Virgia J have Constituted Ordained appointed & impowred Phillip Calvert Esq<sup>r</sup> Deputy Lieu<sup>t</sup> & Chancello<sup>r</sup> of this puince as J doe by these presents Constitute Ordaine & appoint & impower the s<sup>d</sup> Phillip Calvert to repaire to the hono<sup>r</sup>able S<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Berkeley Governo<sup>r</sup> of Virg<sup>a</sup> & the Councill there and after deliery of a duplicate of these presents & to Treat of & determine the s<sup>d</sup> Difference Concerning Watkins point & alsoe to demand Justice against the s<sup>d</sup> Edmund Scarburgh for entring into this province in an hostile maner in Octob<sup>r</sup> last, by blowes & imprisonm<sup>t</sup> outraging the Jnhabitants of Monakin & Anamessecks without Comission as alsoe for Attempting to marke a tree vpon a Point of land above thirty miles to the Northword of Watkins point in May last without Comission or Ord<sup>r</sup> & for
