And yow are to impower the prson by yow to be placed in Comand Ouer the said thirety men to quarter the said men in theire March upp to Capt William Burges in Ann Arundell County or else to presse sufficient provisiones for them in theire sd march to him; And Order the said Comandr Comandr the said Burges to March and him to Obey Or his Collonell Lewis Stockett when prsent, till further Order from mee, And this shall be yor warrt Giuen undr my hand att st Marys this 6th day of June 1665

Whereas by Reason of a late Incursion of the Indians divers present have been pressed out of yor County to goe out for the defence of the Province in Generall whose Cropps if not looked after will in a months time be utterly lost, And the Charge of the Province thereby become very greate Yow are therefore in the name of the Rigt Honble the Ld Propr of this Province
