The bearer hereof Capt: Henry ffleete is hereby licensed to trade with any Indians for corne or roanoke to buy corne, either within this Province of Maryland, or on any part of the Southerne shoare below Patowmeck towne. Provided that he bring the said corne into this colony to be vsed & expended in the colony.
