These are in the Lord Proprietary's name to will and require you that forthwith you attach all such estate or any parte thereof as belongeth unto Captaine William Clayborne now being in the Isle of Kent and that you keepe them safly untill hee shall putt in suffecient securty to answare unto the suite of Capt: George Evelline for William Clobery and Company of London, Marchants in an accōn of accompts to the vallue of fiteene hundred pounds starling at the Courte to be held at S^t Maryes on the first Munday in June which shalbe in the yeare 1639 and to abide the order of the said Courte. Given under my hand this 26th of February 1637.
