p. 7 The Attorney General pursuant to a former Order of this Board the 4th Instant makes Report that having perused and thoroughly considered the Indictment and whole Process against Lewis a Mulatto Prisoner convict and condemned for Burglary finds the Charge to be mean, and but for a very small Matter

Whereupon the Advice and Opinion of this Board in that matter being demanded, It is advised resolved and ordered that the said Mulatto remain in Custody of the Sheriff of S^t Marys County until the first safe convenient Opportunity shall present for his Transportation, and then to be transported to some Other of their Majestys Plantations as an Exile and there to be sold and disposed off to the most Advantage, and Returns thereof to be made to the said Sheriff for the Satisfaction and Discharge of the Charges accruing by his Imprisonment
