When he came to Deal the Fleet was sail'd he went from thence to Portsmth where he met with the Alborough Ketch in which he had a very ill passage to Virginia.

He hopes when his proceedings have been laid before the Councill their Lordships will see he has not been wanting in their Majesty's service.

He understands by M^r Code that a Commission is sent to Cap^t Nicholson to supersede him at which he is much troubled till he knows the truth of it.
