maner, and every shipp or vessell which shall load or take on board any of the aforesaid Goods until such Bond given to the said Gov^r or certificate produced from the Officers of any Custome House of England, Wales or Berwick, That such Bond hath been there duely given shall be forfeited; soe that if any shipp doe goe from England directly to their Majesties Plantations without giving Bond to the Officers of the Custome House in the Port from whence they sayle and carrying Certificate thereof, the Governor is not obliged to take Bond from them in the Plantations but may seize and prosecute such shipp and vessells if they doe presume to load and take on board any of the aforesaid enumerated Goods. And it hath been the constant practise of this Board as much as possible to oblige all Masters of shipp going from England to the Plantations to give such security before they depart, well knowing that the Bonds taken in the Plantations are generally from persons of insufficiency.
