The humble petition of Sam<sup>l</sup> Dryer & Susanna his Wife  
In all humble manner sheweth

That your Petitioner some time since presented your Ex<sup>clly</sup> p. 219  
with a petition setting forth that your Petitioner Susannah  
upon the 7<sup>th</sup> Day of April last was violently set upon in the  
Kings highway by one Ann Greene & dangerously wounded  
beaten & left for dead & robbed of a lutestring hood & Silver  
bodkin that your Petitioners procured a warrant the 9<sup>th</sup> of  
April from Iustice Hammond & caused the said Ann Green  
to be brought before the said Iustice Hammond by Neal  
Clark Constable & altho the said Greene did confess the  
same as your Pet<sup>r</sup> can prove yet did not the said Iustice Ham-  
mond bind the said Greene to appear & answer the same or  
bind her to her good Behaviour or commit her altho your  
Petitioners would have been bound to have prosecuted her

In answer to which petition your Excellency sent a Letter
