Fort William Henry the 3^d April 1693

This Comes to advice your Excellency of my receipt of her
Majestys Directions unto me as Capt Gen & Gov^r of Pensyl-
vania & New Castle &c^a to give assistance to the Province of
New York come by the way of Boston with the Inclosed
whereof I send you a Copy our Ships wherein I understand
the Letters Patents for that Government are not yet arrived
I have likewise directions from the right honble the Lords of
the Treasury for supplying the Commissarys of the Squadron
of Ships Commanded by Sir Francis Wheeler & Land forces
