Accordingly he produced MrThomas Holliday & MrRichard Charlett of Calvert County who are approved of & they become bound for the said Collo Iowles in the sum of two hundred & fifty pounds Sterl a piece & the said Collo Iowles in the sum of Five hundred pounds Sterl to their Majestys in manner aforesaid
