Upon the Complayant's demand of
 ffourteen hundred Ninety two pounds
 of Tobacco and Cask out of the Estate
 of George Manners deceased, Edward

Hall the Defd^{ts} Attorney upon the Complayn^{ts} agreement to
 accept of one thousand pounds of Tobacco and Cask part
 thereof appearing to be due by the Decedent's own account
 before his death Soe as the Administratrix be allowed the
 Remainder Consenteth thereunto, It is thereupon Ordered
 that the Defd^t Shall pay unto the Complayn^t out of the Said
 Decedents Eate one thousand pounds of Tobacco and Cask
 and that She Shall be allowed the S^d remainder, The p^lt make-
 ing the Same appear to be due, But execucōn thereupon is
 Stayed till a twelve Month after the Deced^{ts} death

p. 242 John Nicholls demandeth out of the Estate of George Man-
 ners deceased one hundred and eighty pounds of Tobacco
 payable by bill in November last, And Edward Hall the Attor-
 ney of the Decedent's Adm^rx acknowledgeth the Debt It is
 therefore Ordered that the Adm^rx Shall pay the Same to the
 Comp^lt out of the Deced^{ts} estate but execution is thereupon
 Stayed till a twelve Month after the Said Deced^{ts} death

To the demand of M^r George Mee out of the Estate of
 George Manners deceased, and to all other demands out of
 the s^d Estate not already adjudged, Edward Hall the Attorney
 of Rebecca Manners the Adm^rx desireth respited to make any
 Answ^r till the next Court, that in the meantime he may peruse
 the decd^{ts} accompts for his better Instruction therein, which the
 Court thinks reasonable and doth Order the Same accord-
 ingly, and the Said M^r Mee is then to be heard in the first
 place, he attending the Court and then moveing for that
 purpose
