That he hath paid Doctor Waldron the S^d Nineteene hund^d pounds of Tobacco and Caske, which Said Sumē I this Dep^t and M^r W^m Daynes my brother had formerly given Order unto M^r Henry Coursey our Attorney to pay, Since which time I this Depon^t have paid the Said Tobacco to the Said Waldron in the hands of Esq Ludlo, and further this Depon^t Saith not :

The Deposition of M^r Francis Brooke aged 38 years or thereabouts Sworn in Open Court Saith

That Thomas Medwell desired him he being goeing along with M^r Land to New town to Speak to M^r John Wade Chirurgion to take that title of a Servant from him the Said Medwell, which this Depon^t Meeting with the S^d M^r Wade at at the house of Lieu^t Evans's, did the S^d Medwells message,
