We have not yet been wrote to by M<sup>r</sup> Hughes for a Proof-Master to try the Cannon he agreed with the last Convention to furnish for the Use of this Province or had any satisfactory Information in what Forwardness they are; however as we are anxious to expedite this Business & presume M<sup>r</sup> Hughes must have run some of them by this Time we have appointed Capt.
