Smallwood detach a commissioned Officer to arrest Samuel Purviance jun Chairman of the Committee of Observation for Baltimore County, William Lux Deputy Chairman and George Lux Clerk of said Committee where-ever they may be found in the Province of Maryland; and that the said Officer bring the said Samuel Purviance Junior, William Lux and George Lux to the Council of Safety at Annapolis under a sufficient Guard.

Adjourned till next Day 10 O'Clock.
