Baltimore 23 April 1776.

Hon Sir. I have been unwell for ten days past, nay have been most of the time confined to my Bed with a Fever, of which I am not yet well enough recruited to venture upon a ride to Annapolis. I hope the Hon Council of Safety will excuse my non-attendance for the above reasons I was confined to my bed at the time our Com reced the letters referred to in my Citation, and heard nothing of it till Sunday morning. I have agreeable to the Order of your Hon Board, copied the Papers referred to in your Summons, your Hon. Board, will excuse the Incorrectness, with which they are copied, as it is caused solely by my sickness, for I am at this moment hardly able to hold my pen:

Adjourned till 3 o'Clock & met accordingly.

M^r Samuel Purviance Jun^r Chairman of the Committee of Observation for Baltimore County, in Obedience to the Order of the 20th Instant appeared before the Council, and was informed by the President that, Instructions of a very extraordinary nature from him as Chairman of the Committee of Baltimore County to Cap^t Samuel Smith and other Matters of great Importance had come to the Knowledge of the Committee of Safety, for which they had thought proper to call him before them to answer the Charge which they imported.

The Instructions were then read in Presence of Mr Purviance, and are as follow.
