Richard Bennet Hall of Prince Georges County, Capt<sup>n</sup> of a Company in the twenty fifth Battalion of the Militia of Maryland. begs leave to represent to your Honourable Board, that James Mullikin appointed First Lieutenant of the Company which he commands, has at divers times endeavoured to injure your Memorialist in the opinion of his neighbours by Misrepresentation, thereby creating divisions in the said Company, to the great detriment of the service and particularly by using abusive language to your Memorialist when in the execution of his duty, and by striking and abusing one of the privates of the said Company on the day of Muster-all which your Memorialist submits to your Honours and prays that a Court Martial may be appointed, for hearing and determining this matter and (if your honours think proper) that the said Court be composed of officers from Col: Joseph Sim's Battalion in Prince Georges County.
