We think it most advisable that all the men under your command who have not had the small pox, should be immediately innoculated and desire you would apply to Doct<sup>r</sup> Craig for that purpose you will make the best bargain you can with the Doctor; all necessary expences will be paid by the Council in behalf of the Province.
