And that at another time being at M^r Clark's house & conversing with him on the subject of his not mustering nor attending the Company of Militia, in which said Clark was enrolled, he heard said M^r Clark say, that he would get back again all those fines which he paid to M^r Levy the Clerk of said Company, as he charged M^r Levy with all that he paid on that account ; and that he never would take up Arms in defence of America, or in the present contest.
