3^{dly} An Act phibitting the Transportaccōn & Sale of his Lōpps Ordnance &c was Read. And therevpon Agreed That a New bill now Read, Repealing the former be presented to his Lōp for his Assent.

4^{thly} An Act for Takeing an Oath of ffidelity &c Agreed That A Saveing of our Alleigeance To our Sovereigne Lord the King: be Added to the Oath.

5^{thly} An Act ag^t Rayseing of money wthin this p^vince wthout the Consent of Assembly &:

An Act Concerning Leavying warr within this province, both w^{ch} lawes are de[sired to be] Taken into Consideraccōn by this Grand Committee.

6^{thly} An Act Touthching hoggs and markeing Cattle, agreed to bee repealed 1681

7^{thly} An Act Concerning Deserted plantaccōns, Desired by the Lower house to bee mended. To which The vpper house Answere that if the Lower house can find any way to Assertayne his Lopps Rent to him they will Concurr with them^t therein.

8^{thly} An Act for Recording the Journall of the Lower house, Read and therevpon agreed that a new bill bee drawne leaveing out the word Adjournment.

The house mett and Called all present as Yesterday Except Mr William Richardsons, who being sick has leave to goe home.

Then was read what was done Yesterday.

The house resolve into a grand Committee, And Adjourne into the Councill Chamber: where were p^rsent the vpper house as Yesterday.

Then was read a Bill Entitled An Act Touthching Leavying of warr and Defraying the publique Charge of this province, And the vpper houses Assent thereto, and that the sayd bill, may be presented to his Lōpp with [both houses] for his Lopps Assent to the same, w^{ch} bill Conteynes the sence of Two Other Acts One Entitled An Act for Leavying of warr wthin this p^vince and the Other An Act concerning Rayseing money wthin this province wthout the Consent of an Assembly, and repeales the same.

It was therevpon Put to the Vote, by the members of the upper house in Committee whether the said bill shall pass as it is Yea or Nay
