Then mett According to appointm^t p ord^r of Councell held at the same place the 10th instant, the Greate men of Pascattoway being also appointed to meete here this Day whereupon the Councell consult and advise what necessary to be said to them when they come, and it is resolved that they be given to und^rstand

That whereas a few daies since the Empero^r and One other of their greate men had been with the Governo^r and informed him of some of their Indians being lately killed (as they did beleive) p some of the Senniquo & Susquahannah Indians, and did then offer to the Governo^r severall matters of moment to w^{ch} he did then give noe positive answer, but did assure them that he would send to ffort Albany endeavouring to speake with the greate men of the Sinnequos to know of them what their designe was whither they resolved to hold their Articles with us (amongst w^{ch} One was that they should hold peace with the Piscattoways) & to continue their League, that soe we may hold peace with the Piscattoways soe long as they are willing and doe actually keepe the Peace made with us. The Councell doe readily concurr with the Governo^r therein and doe confirm and approve what he hath done, that Intelligence is daily expected from Albany, w^{ch} when we receive shall give them notice, but till then can give them noe further answer as to that p^ticular.

The next thing to be offered to them being a matter of great consequence was.
