Lowe yor Sheriff lett be delivered with all expedicon the other Packett please to send by a Safe hand to Capta Taylor in Dorchester County it requireing also greate haste to come in time for the Electing of Burgesses for the Assembly, in all weh we doubt not of your care in the least, and have not further to add but our Respects to you We rest
